Despite my decades, I still find there is something mesmerising about Christmas lights and haven't ever quite got over the thrill of seeing them. I can still remember the giddy excitement as a young girl of waiting until darkness fell and being taken from the village where I lived to see the Christmas decorations light up the Promenade in Cheltenham.

There was just something about seeing light transforming the darkness.

Did you manage to get to Salisbury Cathedral in November to see the Sarum Light show which ran over five evenings? You can probably find it on Facebook or YouTube if you didn't!

In a breath-taking programme lasting an hour, light in differing colours, abstract shapes, words, or recognisable images was projected 360 degrees around us, moving in unison with music, seeking out the columns, ribs, towering arches, windows, nooks and crannies of the ancient building and filling the space in between. In a darkened Cathedral, onlookers were held spellbound by the ever-moving array of colours and images reflecting our galaxy and planet, within a building that had been built and dedicated to the God who created them.

Darkness is not limited to the opposite of light though. We face it in many different ways and it can be disorientating and frightening. MAKING CARDS FOR CHRISTMAS

Here are two simple ideas I have used this year which you might also like to use. They are easy enough for children to make, though younger ones will need a helping hand.

BABY JESUS IN THE MANGER



For each card you will need:- a blank card, a small piece of brown paper, a small piece of pink or flesh-coloured paper (or colour a piece of white paper), some thin strips of yellow paper(for the straw) and a larger piece of yellow paper, a small piece of silver or gold paper, scissors, glue.

- 1. Cut out a trapezoid shape from the brown paper to make the manger. Stick it to the card, leaving the top edge unglued for now. Cut out two "feet" for the manager from the brown paper. Stick them in place.
- 2. Draw and cut out a semi-circle from the yellow paper. Stick this under one end of the top edge of the manger. I added a thin line of silver glitter paint around the outer edge of the semi-circle but this is optional.
- 3. Draw and cut out of the pink/flesh-coloured paper half of a face and a baby's hand. Stick these in place (see photo).
- 4. Cut a few thin strips of yellow paper to make straw. Tuck one end of each strip under the top edge of the manger, leaving the other end free. Glue down the top edge of the manger.
- 6. Finally, draw and cut out a star shape from the silver or gold paper and stick it above the manger.

POP-UP CHRISTMAS TREES





For each card you will need:- a blank card, an A4-sized piece of dark green paper, a small piece of spare card, a range of coloured dots, jewel dots, sequins etc for decorating the trees, scissors, glue.

- 1. Using a piece of spare card, make a template of a half Christmas tree.
- 2. Fold the A4-sized green paper in half. Place the straight edge of the card template on the fold, draw round the template and cut out through both layers of the green paper. Unfold the paper and you should have a complete tree. Make three trees in this way.
- 3. Take two of the trees and stick them together back to back down to the middle fold line. Trim to make the trees fit together better if necessary.
- 4. Stick the joined trees into the middle of the card, lining up the fold line in the trees with the fold line in the card (see photo). Stick the third tree to the front of the card.
- 5. Use the coloured dots, jewels, sequins etc to decorate all three trees as you wish.

This method can also be used to make pop-up angels or stars.



OUT AND ABOUT IN THE PARISHPARACHUTE JUMPERS AND MORE AT OLD SARUM AIRFIELD

We've all heard them! First there's the sound of the lift aircraft as it labours to get to its target height. Then there's the roar of the flapping parachutes as they open, followed by the screams of fear and excitement as they drop rapidly down to land at Old Sarum Airfield. Yes, the jumpers are at it again.

But it's worth going closer and seeing the parachutists as they come in to land at the airfield. Some manage to come in on the landing strip but others land further afield and, every now and then, one misses the airfield altogether and ends up on the Old Sarum open space or in a field. A pleasant hour can be spent watching the parachutists and enjoying a hot drink from the airfield café.





Near to the café is a monument that's also worth a look. It was unveiled in 1993 and is dedicated to the 9 A.O.P. squadrons that were formed at Old Sarum during the Second World War. The plaque beneath the bust of an airman reads: "... (their) gallantry and tenacity were to play a vital role in the final victory. They flew light, unarmed aircraft over enemy lines and many paid the ultimate price." They flew mostly over Normandy, Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany but some went as far as North Africa.

If all this has whetted your appetite, there's always the Boscombe Down Aviation Collection museum at the airfield that's good to explore. There's a chance to visit it for free after the Old Sarum and Longhedge "Carols in the Hangar" service at 3p.m. on 5th December.

THANK GOD FOR......DARK STARRY NIGHTS

The other day, while I was stopped at a motorway roundabout, I happened to see a small notice stuck to the fence at the side of the road. It read: "Don't give up hope. When the sun goes down, the stars come out". These words made me smile then and I still smile now when I think of them.

Now that the clocks have gone back and winter is definitely on the way, it's easy to feel down at the prospect of the long dark nights ahead. But on a crisp, clear night when the stars are shining, it's worth wrapping up warm and taking a stroll outside to a place where there is little or no artificial light to gaze up at the heavens above.



The familiar constellations - the Plough, Orion and Cassiopeia - are like old friends, their names learned in childhood and never forgotten. Many is the time I have vowed to make the effort to learn more, but I've not yet got round to it. that includes parents!




JANUARY 21ST




