May can be a month of surprises. It's often beautiful in our gardens, but it is also the month when we have the right to **vote** for our local and national political leaders. This year, local elections are on 5<sup>th</sup> May. What a privilege it is for us to be able to vote for our leaders. It is something many people across the world are literally dying for.

The last few years have thrown up many surprising election results on the international stage. As we have seen only too clearly in recent months, the influence and effects of political leadership can bring out the very best and the very worst in humanity.

As I write this letter, the full outcomes of the Russian invasion of Ukraine are not yet clear. We continue to hear stories both of horror and of heroism. As a church, we pray for peace with justice for the peoples of Ukraine and Russia. But we also add our voices to encourage our political leaders to be more generous and effective in speeding up the processing and welcome we extend to those escaping war. I'm sure that many of us have given money to the Disasters Emergency Committee to help fund the care of the millions of refugees currently being hosted by Poland and other eastern European countries.

For Christians in this Diocese of Salisbury, we are delighted to be able to welcome our new Bishop, Stephen Lake. I worked in a neighbouring parish with him in Poole for several years when he was a parish priest there. I am so glad he's been invited to oversee the churches of our diocese. He was appointed and "elected" to the position. There is then a formal service of **enthronement** when he sits for the first time on the bishop's throne in the Cathedral. The Greek word for chair is "cathedra." The cathedral is literally the place where a bishop has his throne.

But for all followers of Jesus, the month of May is also hugely significant. Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May is **Ascension Day**. Many of us will gather at 7.30 am at the Old Cathedral site on Old Sarum to celebrate Communion. You are welcome! Ascension Day is the time we remember and celebrate Jesus was vindicated by God. Jesus died, then he was raised from death, then he "ascended" the throne in heaven and is now seated in glory.

Every time we pray the **Lord's Prayer**, we are inviting the rule and reign of King Jesus, the Prince of Peace, to be extended over our lives and this world. In all its frailty, brokenness, and pain, this world is still dearly loved by God. I encourage you to **pray this prayer each day** in your home and welcome the peace of God into you own life and your loved ones.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name; your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread, and forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now for ever. Amen.

### CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 15TH - 21ST MAY

Christian Aid is based in countries affected by disasters so is on the ground before, during and after an emergency to save lives and support people long term. The focus since the Russian invasion has been to support Ukraine and an emergency appeal has been set up to alleviate suffering in that area. They continue to also support other countries with ongoing problems resulting from food insecurity, conflict, adverse weather aggravated by climate change, and lack of employment, education and health care. South Sudan is a good example of this.

Between 15th - 21st May a Christian Aid envelope will be posted through every postbox in the parish and a few days later one of our volunteers will knock on your door to collect it. We trust that, despite our problems, people will respond generously.

### HOPE CHURCH - WHO ARE WE?

Hope Church was 2 years old in March 2022!

The official opening event was on 15th March 2020 but, since we had to shut down almost immediately because of the pandemic, we were meeting on-line for much of the next 12-18 months. It's not surprising, therefore, that some people who are new to the area and/or the parish are not familiar with the background to Hope and who we are. So, here's the backstory....

The story really begins with the appointment of Will and Sophie Burditt as Community Pastors in 2016. They came to live in Old Sarum with the vision to provide opportunities for people to creatively explore church and faith, as well as build community and support for those in Old Sarum and Longhedge. They grew into a small community that was committed to bringing real hope to the neighbourhood. A few years later, after much prayer and discussion, it was decided to develop this idea into a church, so St Francis sent a small team of individuals and families up the road to start Hope Church, using the Old Sarum and Longhedge Community Centre as a meeting place.



We started Hope Church because we love Old Sarum and Longhedge and we believe God does too. We believe church is far more than a building or an event on a Sunday morning. You'll find friendships, opportunities to serve the neighbourhood, and space to grow in faith. We aim to be a church full of creativity and hope all centred on Jesus. But you're invited to be part of Hope whether you know anything about Jesus or not, whoever you are, wherever you're from, and whatever your life looks like right now, we'd love to welcome you to Hope Church.

Since the Covid restrictions began to be lifted last year, we have been meeting in the Community Centre every Sunday morning. Our gatherings are very informal and welcome all ages. We always start with coffee and pastries and then explore a theme around life and the Bible together. There is plenty on offer for children and Hope prides itself on its family feel. There are always stories, games, activities and lots of fun for small children. Our Connect groups which run midweek are great places for adults to explore faith further and connect with others.



Messy Church is at 10.00 a.m. on the second Sunday of the month, with creative activities, crafts, and games for all ages. Messy Church is always lots of fun and a great place to start if you are thinking of coming along to see what we do. We're also involved in lots of other events throughout the year such as the Egg Hunt, Summer Fun Day and Carols in the Hangar.

Thursday 26th May is Ascension Day when we celebrate Jesus returning to the Father, to a position of authority and power. 
Have you ever wondered how the universe began, what the point of life might be, or whether God likes science? Then this is the book for you!



### **MISSION FOCUS**

#### **Church Mission Society**

The Church Mission Society is an organisation which aims to bring the love of Christ to people around the world. Founded in 1799 by a group of activist Christians which included the anti-slavery campaigner William Wilberforce, CMS now supports mission partners in some 40 countries across Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Middle East and Europe (including the UK).

St Francis supports CMS mission partners Anna and Chris Hembury (<a href="https://churchmissionsociety.org/people-in-mission/anna-and-chris-hembury/">https://churchmissionsociety.org/people-in-mission/anna-and-chris-hembury/</a>); here is how they introduce themselves:

We live in an area of Hull where people are known for their no-nonsense attitude and honest vulnerability, an area suffering from high unemployment, child poverty, addiction, mental and physical health problems, prostitution and increasing racial tension. People feel a crippling lack of self-worth. But it's an area full of buried treasure, untapped potential and dormant creativity.

We support a group who are living in a CMS house for mission and serving our local

community. We help look after a community garden and a sort of drop in/sofa-church in our neighbourhood. We help run Orts, a sewing collective.... We work alongside the Hull Youth For Christ team, supporting children, young people and families.

In a recent Link Letter, Anna wrote about Orts (the word means "waste scraps"), a project supported by St Francis:

"It's a sewing collective, but it's not really about the sewing!" The sewing is a crucial element: creative expression, having a go, learning new skills, upcycling and re-purposing old clothes, making a quirky bird (usually the first thing we get the women to have a go at) or a new skirt... The context of textiles is another key element in the mix: the mood-altering spectrum of colours, the tangible softness and sensory aspect that the fabrics lend to the women on days...when life is just plain tough. Skill sharing, confidence building, turning waste scraps into saleable items... sharing food and humour, being a safe and brave space for women.... But it's love that is the key ingredient..... Four weeks ago, a new lady, Sam (name changed), came to Orts. She grew up in the care system, her home/relationship situation is hard and complicated, and she struggles daily with her mental health. The first few hours following her arrival was a verbal torrent of the pain, dark humour, childhood trauma and irreconcilable conflicts that shape her world.....

### THANK GOD FOR ..... BUTTERFLIES



As a child I can remember standing in my parents' suburban garden watching clouds of butterflies on a Buddleia bush. There were many different kinds – Red Admirals, Small Tortoiseshells, Large Tortoiseshells, Painted Ladies, Commas, Peacocks and, of course, Large and Small Whites. All of these species were quite common in those days. Now, sadly, nearly all of them are in decline, many drastically so, and the Large Tortoiseshell is extinct as a resident in this country. So, there is all the more reason to rejoice when a butterfly graces us with a flight in and across our field of view. The earliest to appear are usually the yellow Brimstones (see picture above). The males are a brighter yellow than the females, but both sexes have an orange spot in the middle of each wing. They are quite large butterflies and, unusually, they fold their wings when they land, which can make them hard to see. They usually start to appear in March but are at their most numerous in April and May when they come out of hibernation, with a smaller peak in numbers in the late summer.

So far this year I have seen Brimstones, a small Tortoiseshell and a Peacock in our garden, not a large haul in spite of all the bee-and butterfly-friendly plants we have added over the last few years. I'm hoping for more, as they bring such joy. Yes, thank God for the delicate beauty of butterflies!


