I love being a dad (at least most of the time). I am delighted that the older my children get, the more I enjoy being with them. But one thing about families is that we know better than anyone else how to drive each other round the bend.

We know what makes our loved ones laugh and cry, and we know which buttons to press to make them angry. Through my 27 years of being a dad, there is one thing that makes me more angry and frustrated than anything else. It's when my children fight or are unkind to each other.

Most of the time they do get on well together (praise the Lord!) but when they were younger there were occasions when fists would fly and yells were loud. At such times, I found my blood-pressure going higher than normal. I sometimes found I ended up shouting louder than all of them put together. It's not that I wanted to get cross. In fact, it was quite the opposite. I love all of them so much that when they fight or hurt each other it really upsets me – and so I get angry.

I am quite clear that God feels the same. He looks at the world – filled with his children that he loves. I'm sure he sometimes wants to shout, "Why can't you just play nicely together?"

The Church of God is made up different groups of his children who all want to grow in their relationship with their same Heavenly Father. Down the centuries, sometimes we have often hurt each other. Mostly accidentally, but sometimes deliberately. I thank God that in recent years most churches are getting better at "playing nicely" together. Through worship, study and praying with each other, we are coming to recognise the family likeness more clearly in each other.

I was delighted that this Easter Christians from different local Churches met on the Old Sarum Cathedral site at 6 am to worship the risen Jesus together. Every month, many church leaders from across Salisbury meet together to pray for our city.

I believe our Heavenly Father looks down with joy and is especially pleased to join us when we have these sorts of gatherings. Then the words of Jesus are closer to being fulfilled: "All people will know that you are my disciples if you love one another." I think we are getting there!

We pray that the peoples of Ukraine and Russia may be able to recognise they are brothers and sisters despite the current horrors of war. And we also pray that families in our city that are in pain may find reconciliation, healing and new love.



THANK GOD FOR...... FOXGLOVES


It's been a great year so far for wild flowers. I've not long returned from a week in Devon, where the hedgerows and banks were covered in red campion, wild garlic, stitchwort and bluebells, (God's red, white and blue show for the Queen's Jubilee, which surpassed anything we could offer!) Looking around Salisbury now, it's the turn of the cow parsley, valerian and poppies – but, above all, it's the foxgloves that catch my eye.

Foxgloves pop up in all sorts of surprising places. Their seeds are tiny and spread far and near, which means that they can suddenly appear from nowhere. They seem to be equally at home in sun and shade and they are therefore often tallest and most luxurious on the edges of woods, where they enjoy dappled sunlight. However, they also grow well on exposed moorlands, where they are often the only flowers in sight.

They don't like to be too dry, which probably explains why I have had no luck in growing them at home over the last few hot, very dry summers. That is, until this year. Perhaps it's the cooler temperatures we have had so far, or perhaps because we have had more cloud and rain then usual, but this year the seeds I scattered last autumn all seem to have germinated and the garden is full of beautiful foxglove flowers. Most of them are the usual pinky-purple but there are also a lot of peach-coloured ones. The bees love them, dipping in and out of the flowers to collect nectar – rarely have I seen the garden so full of insect life!



Of course, the downside of foxgloves is that all parts of them are poisonous, so anyone with small children and/or pets needs to take special care. However, the drug digitalin, which is derived from foxgloves, is still in use today for certain heart conditions, yet another reason for saying: "Thank God for foxgloves!"


