

One of these shapes is called **Bouba** and the other is called Kiki. No matter which language in the world we speak, we will almost certainly have decided which is which - and almost certainly it's the same as everyone else!



Part of being human means that we seek patterns and meaning. In the early



twentieth century a Swiss psychiatrist called Rorschach found that most people could look at apparently random ink blots on a folded piece of paper and their brains would create meaning.

We can't help but "see" something we recognize in the shape – and this is a universal human quality.

It is like spirituality - finding meaning and patterns in our lives.

As I look back over my life, I cannot help but see the hand of God at work. Others might choose to say that at times I was "lucky" or "unlucky". But that's not how it feels to me. I believe and choose to trust that there has been a loving, good, generous, God watching over me and calling me to find him in all things.

Some years ago a person took a photo of a rocky mountainside covered with snow. It is a simple black and white image - then suddenly they could "see" an image of

Jesus in it. As I have looked at this picture, I've found I can see him too. Can you?

It usually takes a bit of time as our brains try out different possibilities on the shape. And then there comes a moment of clarity. The face was there all along, I just couldn't see it at first.

Whether or not you can "see" Jesus in the

picture really doesn't matter. But encountering God in our daily lives is the most sustaining and joyful thing we can experience. I believe it is what we were all created for - to know and enjoy the presence of God.

And in case you were wondering, Kiki is on the right.



It's now nearly 7 years since Will and Sophie Burditt moved into the diocesan house in Robin Road. Old Sarum, and became "Community Pastors" for Old Sarum and Longhedge. What a lot of changes there have been since then! In 2016 the Longhedge estate had barely been started but now it is nearly complete. The role of "Community Pastors" was overtaken by the beginning of Hope Church, which took place in 2020, just before the first lockdown and which has been run by Will and Sophie ever since. WHAT'S HAPPENINGJUNE

After all the celebrations we saw in May with the new King Charles' coronation, June brings still more. June sees Fathers' Day and the Summer Solstice. June 21st/22nd is the Longest Day in the Northern Hemisphere and some see it as the start of summer with plays of Shakespeare's Midsummer Night's Dream making the rounds. In the early Christian church, however, it was also the day when John the Baptist was remembered. John was a miracle baby for Zachariah and Elizabeth, and as a man he prepared the people's hearts for Jesus, they repented, were baptized and then John baptized Jesus himself. The Gospel of Matthew Chapter 3 v 16 and 17 (NKJV) says "When He had been baptized, Jesus came immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened to Him, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting upon Him. And suddenly a voice came from heaven saying, 'This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased'.'

Here we not only see Jesus as God's son but also that God is a Father. In the Old Testament. God the Father is referred to as Father approximately 13 times, but in the New Testament God as Father is mentioned by Jesus over a hundred times as well as in the letters in the New Testament. I love how God states, clearly that Jesus is His Son and that He is pleased, happy. It reminds me of the beginning of the Bible when God is creating Earth and God saw "it was good" - Genesis Ch 1 v 10, v12, v 18, v21, v25, v31. As a parent with three children completing exams, I remind myself daily to tell them how proud I am of them. It can be a stressful time for young people with hormones and the need to "get it right"! I can't take the exams for them or take it away from them, but I can say how pleased I am with them and that they're amazina!

THE SALISBURY-SUDANS PARTNERSHIP

The Salisbury-Sudans partnership is amongst the most active in the Church of England.

St Francis church supports South Sudan through many individual sponsorships of pupils at Juba Diocesan Model Secondary School - and in prayer.

In March the Partnership held its annual 'Sudans Day' at St Francis church. Canon Ian Woodward, Chairman of the Salisbury Sudans Partnership shares this encouraging extract from the day: "The issue of greatest concern is the continuing ethnic conflicts in both countries: South Sudan and Sudan. "After a welcome from Bishop Stephen, Her Excellency Ambassador Agnes Oswaha (the South Sudan Ambassador to London) outlined her government's plans for peace and the nationwide elections to be held in 2024 and the opportunities for people across the country to take part in more localised government. The UK Government, with the United States and Norway, known as the Troika are guarantors of the peace agreement that led to the division of Sudan and South Sudan.

"Dr Anna Butchart (the Deputy Head of the Sudans Unit in the Foreign and Commonwealth Office) updated participants on UK's continuing brokerage efforts to bring an end to the fighting, for without peace our efforts in education, health care and development can so easily come to nothing.



"Robert Hayward gave a presentation on his recent visits to Khartoum, Juba and Abyei reporting on the needs of the Episcopal Churches in Sudan and South Sudan and how and where our funds are being spent there.

"Dr Karen Mounce and Mrs Anne Salter updated the group on our flourishing Sudans Medical Link. They recently spent two weeks in Western Equatoria visiting the 16 clinics which the Medical Link supports with dispensing basic drugs and the training of midwives and clinical assistants.

"Canon Jeremy Cresswell outlined our work with four theological education colleges and a number of Church Schools that we support, and Dr Eeva John shared the progress being made with the Episcopal University in Rokon in South Sudan.

"Deanery Links are at the heart of the partnership's thinking and Sarah Musgrave gave a refreshing presentation on forming Marlborough's link with an agricultural project in the Diocese of Morobo on the border with Uganda. "So the Salisbury – Sudan partnership remains ever more engaged and active, as it has over the past 50 years."

Summarised from the Diocese of Salisbury Grapevine 20 April 2023 ...

Archbishop of Sudan evacuates Cathedral amid fighting



Archbishop Ezekiel Kondo, primate of the Episcopal Church of Sudan, Aug. 6, 2022. By Neil Turner/The Lambeth Conference

Until recently there was optimism ... in Sudan ... for an abiding peace after more than 30 years of conflict.

However very serious fighting broke out in Khartoum and other parts of Sudan early on Saturday morning 15th April, forcing thousands of civilians to flee ... Both forces have substantial artillery ... extensive damage to the airport in Khartoum ... more than 200 people have been killed and more than a thousand injured.

We spoke to Archbishop Ezekiel Kondo the Primate of the Episcopal Church in his Cathedral compound last Saturday (15th April) ... his family and clergy and their families were in lockdown but felt secure though much fighting was localized ...

Tuesday (18th April) ... a harrowing message from His Grace ... 'Due to the seriousness of the situation, we have evacuated the Cathedral with all the children,42 persons in number! ... They destroyed cars, cafeteria, store ... breaking one of the offices. I believe they will break (into) family houses ...'

Wednesday ... Archbishop Ezekiel said they had escaped from the compound and walked for more than an hour and a half until they reached relative safely.

... imagine the terror of such a walk ... constant noise of gunfire and air attacks, picking their way through smoke and rubble ... they have water but very little food ... the only power is in short supply ... just enough to recharge his phone.

The World Food Programme has suspended food distribution following the death of three workers.

... The next few days are crucial ...

By the time of this Link publication, there will have been more news from Sudan - the request from Archbishop Ezekiel Kondo and Salisbury Diocese remains:

Please pray for Sudan and indeed South Sudan too.

An abiding ceasefire is essential, then a political resolution and harmony in the wider region and we will bend our minds to how we can help heal the wounds.

EASY CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES FOR FATHERS' DAY.

Ingredients:

120g butter, softened 75g light brown sugar 75g golden caster sugar 1 medium egg 1 tsp vanilla extract 180g plain flour 1⁄2 tsp bicarbonate of soda

150g dark chocolate, cut into chunks



Method:

STEP 1

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4 and line two baking sheets with parchment. Cream the butter and sugar together until very light and fluffy, then beat in the egg and vanilla. Once combined, stir in the flour, bicarb, chocolate and ¼ tsp salt.

STEP 2

Scoop 10 large tbsps of the mixture onto the trays, leaving enough space between each to allow for spreading. Bake for 10-12 mins or until firm at the edges but still soft in the middle – they will harden a little as they cool. Leave to cool on the tray for a few mins before eating warm, or transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Will keep for three days in an airtight container.

Alabaré's Boots on the Ground programme

Local charity Alabaré provides support and accommodation for people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless across Wiltshire and the South West.

Alabaré's Boots on the Ground programme is supporting both young people and veterans, providing mental health support by delivering a range of outdoor activities, and by providing volunteering opportunities on community projects. The team have recently taken a group of young people for a residential week in the New Forest where they joined in with activities such as outdoor cooking, animal tracking and team-building. Some of Alabaré's veterans are also involved with developing the Community Garden at Arundells in Salisbury. Those who are taking part in all these activities are finding it of huge benefit to their wellbeing, confidence and self-esteem. As resident Ryan says, "I don't usually go out much due to social anxiety but Boots on the Ground allows me to meet new people in a comfortable environment.
