Letter from Mary, the Curate

During the summer, a walk across the fields from Broadchalke village took me to discover for the first time the Chalke Valley Watercress Farm. It was quite an extraordinary sight seeing watercress being cultivated on this scale. Apparently the farm was started in 1880 and is now run by the sixth generation of the same family.



Here are some fun facts about watercress:



- Hippocrates, the father of medicine, is said to have located his first hospital close to a stream to ensure fresh watercress to help treat his patients.
- Greek soldiers were given it as a tonic before going into battle and the 16th Century herbalist Culpepper claimed it could cleanse the blood.
- It is brimming with more than 15 essential vitamins and minerals. Gram for gram, it contains more iron than spinach, more vitamin C than oranges and more calcium than milk.
- Liz Hurley has been rumoured to drink seven watercress smoothies a day.

For some strange reason this superfood has spent decades being pushed to the side of a plate as nothing more than a decorative garnish.

I wonder how often we miss other nuggets of treasure that are within sight, but not recognised and perhaps overlooked. The Bible records how Jesus used everyday examples to explain what the kingdom of heaven was like – a shepherd searching for sheep, a woman looking for a lost coin, a father longing for the return of a wayward son – and many others.

At St Francis Church we believe that there is a Creator God behind this world we live in; a God who loves and treasures all that it contains – which includes us – and we love trying to explore the many different ways that love is revealed. We also believe that it is possible to learn to know this God and to walk this life alongside him. If that sounds as incredible as the nutritional value of watercress – well, so be it. This world is full of surprises; the key is to keep our hearts and minds open to the wonders!

The week before this, Jean de Garis visited us to finish our course of sermons on The Lord's Prayer.


Hope Church resumes on 20th August with the first of two sessions on evangelism, followed by a series of talks on the "I Am" claims of Jesus and what these mean for us.










BOOK CORNER

This month we are looking at books to encourage our teenagers as they move on to college, university and the world of work.





WATERCRESS SMOOTHIE Ingredients

- · 85g watercress
- · 160g mango, peeled & roughly chopped
- · 110g cucumber, roughly chopped
- · 1/2 an avocado
- · 4 dried apricots
- · 8g parsley
- · 350ml water
- · Nutmeg to finish

Method

Place all of the ingredients into a high-speed blender. Blitz until velvety smooth and drink immediately or chill and keep in the fridge for up to three days. Add nutmeg to taste before serving.

SIMPLE WATERCRESS SOUP Ingredients

- · One onion diced
- · One potato diced
- · A few handfuls (about 150g) of watercress
- ·1 litre good quality chicken stock
- · A teaspoon of butter and a splash of olive oil Method

In a large saucepan on a medium heat, melt the butter and olive oil together and gently cook the chopped onion for 2-3 minutes, or until soft and translucent but not coloured. Add the other ingredients and simmer until the potato is cooked. Blend and season, to taste, with salt and freshly ground black pepper if required. (A spoonful of crème fraîche swirled through is also nice).
