EVENSONG AT ST LAWRENCE

Chaucer's "Canterbury Tales" opens with words about showers in April. It's also a month famous for rain in England due to the popular saying: "April showers bring May flowers."

This reflects the common occurrence of wet weather during the month. April is a transitional month between winter and spring, characterized by changing weather patterns. These are associated with the warmer



temperatures which increase atmospheric moisture as spring progresses.

We might actually find April showers quite useful if we are British. Rather than enduring an awkward silence with someone we recognise but hardly know, we can revert to a safe conversation about having a lot of weather recently. Too much or too little of the wet stuff is usually a safe topic. Although we might complain about the rain, we know that it is actually necessary and good in appropriate amounts.

Some things we know are good for us, but not pleasant (like medicine) whilst other things are pleasant but not good for us (like chocolate). I don't think that there are very many things that are both.

See how good and how pleasant it is for brothers to live together in unity!

Psalm 133:1

But Psalm 133 reminds me of the daily miracle when family members can live together in close, loving, happy, and harmonious relationships.

It's one of the few things both **good** AND **pleasant**. The Psalm ends with the promise that a family living in unity is the place where God chooses to "bestow his blessing: even life for evermore".

That is something really worth working for with all our energy. Let's seek that blessing in our families and in the family of God.



MISSION We have two missions this month: one local and one in the wider global community, both doing essential work.

MAF, Mission Aviation Fellowship, is one of the operations we support.

In case you have not had the chance to read my earlier reports on the work of MAF, I will start with brief details about what this amazing organisation does:

MAF is an organisations that helps isolated communities in need, using small planes to access remote locations. The concept started in 1945 when 3 young pilots felt that this was something that they could be involved with. Starting with one plane, it has grown enormously, and now operates 138.

MAF's vision is 'To see isolated people changed by the love of Christ.'

- Imagine if your community had no roads and little access to the outside world
- How would you or your family reach a doctor if you were sick or injured? How can you receive an education or job opportunities?
- This is the reality for millions of people
- Jungles, mountains, swamps, insecurity and a dilapidated infrastructure are all barriers to receiving physical and spritual care and a hope for the future.





MAF combines the work of evangelism and the love of Jesus Christ, bringing the Gospel to people along with looking after their medical welfare and spiritual needs. They use planes positively to spread the peace of God rather than negatively to spread conflict.

MAF partners with many other charities and their latest news magazine explains how they help a medical mission with a portable laboratory to check the safety and quality of medicines being supplied to rural communities.

Each quarter they produce a magazine full of articles about recent work they have done, together with a small booklet that gives subjects for prayer for every day of the week.

Currently they are concerned about the difficulties of finding and training more pilots. Just as important are the engineers who maintain the planes - without engineers there can be no flights. MAF run their own training school but they do need candidates to train. Would you be interested in this amazing opportunity to have a career full of variety and excitement which spreads the news of Jesus' love and is also vital to support those who live in remote locations?

MISSION



Salisbury Women's Refuge

2023 was our first year without any funding from Wiltshire Council under any form of contract; we do claim Housing Benefit for our residents, and were able to agree a higher weekly rate for this during the year, but it was still a difficult year financially, and forced us to concentrate on fund-raising to a greater extent than we have done previously. I was delighted that we were successful in some of our bids, to the tune of £35,000, but fundraising is a time-consuming and frustrating exercise, and we will have to repeat this success every year (with an increased amount) to keep the Refuge running.

On a more positive note, we have completed almost all of the major items of repair and refurbishment that we had identified, so our costs in this area should be lower for a few years at least.

We managed one noticeable first during the year – a baby was born in the Refuge! We have had new babies there before, but this time the mother did not allow time to get to the hospital. The baby featured a few weeks later as the baby Jesus in our annual crib service, sleeping peacefully throughout. The service was led by our very own Jean de Garis, and our organist Nicola played a keyboard to accompany the singing, so there was good support from St Francis.

Following resignations during the year we will very soon be starting to look for new Trustees. If anyone feels that they want to help the Refuge going forward, and would like to find out about what being a Trustee involves, please contact me.

One of the many "teams behind the scenes" at St Francis can be found working hard at the back of church every Sunday. The sound and vision desk is a hive of activity as the team make sure that the sound levels are right for the singers and instruments of the worship band and that everyone in church can easily see the words to songs, that images or videos are clear and, most importantly, that everything happens in the right order!


Every Sunday two volunteers run the desk, one on sound and one on vision. Our thanks go out to all of them as it can be quite high pressure when things don't go to plan (or if clergy swap the order of service unexpectedly!) Thank you to Brian, Calum, Martin, Moira, Sam, Marie, Graham, and all those who have served in this way before them.

The sound and vision desk - a thing of beauty to those who are technically minded, is alive with screens and wires going in all directions!

...AND AT HOPE CHURCH...

If operating St Francis's audio visual system is like serving dinner from your own well-equipped kitchen, at Hope Church it's more like a roadside picnic wondering whether everything is in the hamper and packing up in a hurry because another family is hovering by the bench! When Hope started, we kindly loaned used equipment Lytchett Minster. Soon John, who first learned about tech thirty years ago from Gareth at St Francis, was ready to design our own system. It needed to be extremely flexible as regards layout and capability, rapid to set up and put away, and must all be stored securely in limited space. Oh yes, and he had to stick to a budget! He built a rackmounted system making use wireless technology where possible, projecting visuals onto a bare wall and mixing sound via an iPad. Everything is set up and run each week by fatherdaughter team John and Emma. They are currently enjoying having more sound channels to mix as our worship group grows and develops.





CHICKEN & CHORIZO JAMBALAYA

Prep: 10 mins Cook: 45 mins



Easy



Serves 4

A healthy Cajun-inspired rice pot recipe that's bursting with spicy Spanish sausage, sweet peppers and tomatoes.

Ingredients

1 tbsp olive oil

2 chicken breasts, chopped

1 onion, diced

1 red pepper, thinly sliced

2 garlic cloves, crushed

75g chorizo, sliced

1 tbsp Cajun seasoning

250g long grain rice

400g can plum tomato

350ml chicken stock

RECIPE TIPS

USE UP LEFTOVER CAJUN SEASONING

Cut 2 chicken breasts into strips, mix

1 tbsp of Cajun seasoning with a little oil

and rub all over the chicken. Fry for 6-8

mins until golden and cooked through.

Serve with guacamole, soured cream,

a tub of salsa and some flour tortillas.



Method

STEP 1

Heat 1 tbsp olive oil in a large <u>frying pan</u> with a lid and brown 2 chopped chicken breasts for 5-8 mins until golden.

STEP 2

Remove and set aside. Tip in the 1 diced onion and cook for 3-4 mins until soft.

STEP 3

Add 1 thinly sliced red pepper, 2 crushed garlic cloves, 75g sliced chorizo and 1 tbsp Cajun seasoning, and cook for 5 mins more.

STEP 4

Stir the chicken back in with 250g long grain rice, add the 400g can of tomatoes and 350ml chicken stock. Cover and simmer for 20-25 mins until the rice is tender.


